Japanese Language and Culture Classes

through the General Education Program (For Credit)

Eligibility: Must be undergraduate, graduate, exchange or auditing student

General Education classes are divided into required and elective classes. In elective classes, it is possible to take two levels at a time as long as you do not skip a level. **You must pass the level below or the placement test in order to go to a higher level.**

Japanese Language Classes at Other Universities

Eligibility: Must be an undergraduate, graduate or exchange student

Content: As part of the University Consortium Ehime, international students at Ehime University, Matsuyama University and Matsuyama Shinonome College can take Japanese Language classes at any of these universities. Please ask at your own university for a list of the classes and a prerequisite for the classes at the other universities.

Ehime University Japanese Language Program

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CIE Program (Non-Credit)

1) Survival Course (Johoku Campus)

This is a special two-week intensive course that has been developed at Ehime University. All new students are encouraged to attend and, if there is space, visiting researchers, foreign faculty members and spouses are welcome, too. The course consists of two parts; Language Skills and Life Skills which teaches the basics about living in Matsuyama. If you already speak Japanese, but you are new to Matsuyama, it is recommended that you take the Life Skills program. The course will be offered at the Johoku Campus from April 4th. The Japanese Language Course begins as soon as the Survival Course ends so you are encouraged to continue your language study.

2) Intensive Japanese Language Course (Johoku Campus)

This is an intensive beginner's course for research students and teacher trainees who have received a Japanese government scholarship. It may be possible for other students to join with the permission of the CIE director. This course is offered each term only at the Johoku campus at the CIE. Students in the course are expected to attend all the classes. The Kanji, Hiragana and Katakana classes and the class on Japanese culture are open to all students. The class on Japanese culture is taught in English.

3) Japanese Language Course

These classes are for those who can not take the Intensive Course or who want to continue their language studies. If space allows, foreign guest researchers and foreign faculty members can also join. Beginning through advanced classes are offered at the Johoku Campus, and beginning and lower intermediate levels are offered at the Tarumi .

You can take two levels at the same time as long you do not skip a level **but must pass the level below or take the placement test in order to go to a higher level.**

If you plan to take a class on the Johoku campus and have not passed the lower level class, then you are required to take a placement test. Placement test times and place are listed below.

Japanese Language and Culture Classes

through the General Education Program (For Credit)

Eligibility: Must be undergraduate, graduate, exchange or auditing student

These classes are for those who are undergraduate, graduate, exchange or auditing students. General Education classes are divided into required and elective classes. You can get the registration form at International Office. In elective classes, it is possible to take two levels at a time as long as you do not skip a level. You must pass the level below or the placement test in order to go to a higher level. The placement test schedule is as follows:
