

Second Semester 2018 Ehime University Japanese Language Program

Ehime University encourages all international students to study Japanese and for that purpose the Institute of International Relations (IIR) offers a comprehensive Japanese Education Program. In addition to the IIR program, Japanese language and culture classes are offered for credit through the General Education program. It is also possible to take Japanese language classes at two other universities in Matsuyama through the University Consortium Ehime.

【Content】

This course starts where the Survival Course ends. Emphasis is on conversation. This course also includes Introduction of Hiragana, Introduction of Katakana, Japanese Kanji A2, and "Studies on Japanese culture". Students are expected to attend all classes.

4. Other Classes

● Academic Japanese and Japanese Culture and Society

【Eligibility】

Must be undergraduate, graduate, exchange or auditing student (must have the Japanese language level of intermediate or more)

【Caution】

Academic Japanese (1,2,3,4) and Japanese Culture and Society (A1, A2, B1, B2) are credit-class for the undergraduate students. Students other than undergraduate must read up on the syllabus and register by themselves. Academic Japanese is regarded as "English" of General Education Class and Japanese Culture and Society are regarded as classes classified in subject inquiry and field of academic study.
