#### 【Content】

The Survival Course consists of two online programs: Language Skills and Life Skills.

##### Life Skills:

During the class we will discuss amongst others how to prepare for your stay in Japan, how to adjust to everyday life and how other exchange students experience Ehime. Even if you do not need the language class, you are encouraged to attend Life Skills. This class is conducted in English.

##### Language Skills:

Basic listening and speaking skills needed in everyday life are taught in the Language Skills classes. Reading and writing will not be taught. Classes are conducted in Japanese. This direct method is very effective in courses like this. If you do have trouble understanding some point, please feel free to ask after class.
