University of Ulsan Summer Korean Language & Culture Program is a summer short-term program in which students from UOU's partner universities in Japan can learn Korean language and Korean culture for around three weeks during summer vacation. During the period, students will have the opportunity to improve their Korean language skills through Korean classes and experience Korean culture through various activities such as visiting various spots in Ulsan and Gyeongju city and experiencing Korean traditional culture. - **1.Qualification:** Students enrolled at UOU's partner university in Japan and interested in Korean language and Korean culture
- 2. Required documents
 - a. Application form (Please find the attached file)
 - b. Personal statement (Backside of the application form)
 - c. Colored copy of passport
- 3. Documents submission deadline: May 1 (Thu)
 - * Please email the list of applicants if you cannot submit the documents before the deadline.
- **4. Program period:** August 7 (Thu) 2025 ~ August 22 (Fri) 2025
- 5. Program Fee: 1,380,000 KRW (30,000 KRW for health insurance included)
 - *Applicants who already have an insurance such as traveler's insurance from Japan, may choose not to pay for UOU insurance. (Cost of training program without insurance fee: 1,350,000 KRW)
 - *Program fee must be paid no later than June 15(Sun) 2025.
 - *If the number of participants is not enough, the cost could increase.

8. Details of program

1) Korean Language class

- 14 Korean lesson (3 hours for each lesson)
- 4 different levels of classes (Level 1 ~ Level 4) will be offered depending on the student's proficiency.
- Students will take level test to be enrolled at a right level of class.

2) Korean Cultural Experience (Related to the Korean Language classes)

- Pottery Making: An experience where you can create your own breath-taking Onggi pottery.
- Traditional Games: Experience traditional Korean games such as Yutnori, Jegichagi, and Gonggi.
- K-POP Dance Experience: Learn choreography of popular K-POP songs.
- Watching Korean Movie and Playing Board Games: Activities that allow you to bond with classmates and Korean partners.
- Visiting an Amusement Park: Visit a Korean amusement park (Gyeongju World).
- Ulsan Tour: A visit to famous tourist spots in Ulsan (Daewangam Park and Jangsaengpo Whale Culture Village).
- Gyeongju Tour: A visit to various cultural heritage sites in Gyeongju, the ancient capital of Silla.

General information for 2025 UOU SKLCP

1. Arrival and Return

- Arrival date: August 5 (Tue) 2025 ~ August 6 (Wed) 2025

- Return date: August 23 (Sat) 2025

2. Pick-up

- Pick-up service is offered during arrival date.
- Pick-up Place: Gimhae(Busan)Airport, Busan Port International Passenger Terminal.

3. Dormitory

- On campus dormitory will be offered.
- A twin room dormitory will be provided. (including cooling facilities, toilets and bathrooms)

4. Meal

- Breakfast is included
- Lunch or dinner is at your own expenses.

5. Visa

- Japanese: No visa required (You can stay in Korea without a visa for up to 90 days)
- Foreigner with other nationality: Please check if visa is exempted or not. If necessary, ask for an assistance.

FAQ on Living for 2025 UOU SKLCP

Q) How much does laundry cost?

A) In the dormitory, laundry cost is free.

Q) Do I need to exchange currency?

A) From the day you arrive in Korea, you will need Korean currency for meals and shopping, so please bring cash in KRW. Students who want to exchange money in Ulsan also can visit the bank in the campus. You can also use credit cards in most of places in Korea.

Q) How much does it cost to live for three weeks?

A) It varies from person to person. Breakfast is included in the fee, but lunch and dinner are at your own expenses. The meals at restaurants near campus are about 15,000 KRW.

Q) Can I use Wifi in the dormitory?

A) You can access Wi-Fi through the school wireless Internet, but depending on the distance from the router, there are rooms where Wi-Fi is not working well.

Q) Does UOU offer pillows and bedding?

A) Yes, it will be provided. You can also bring your own bedding if you want. But please bring you own hair dryer if you need.

Q) Is the distance between the dormitory and the classroom far?

A) You will stay in the on-campus dormitory. The classroom is very close to the dormitory.

Q) How about insurance?

A) Students are advised to sign up for UOU medical insurance. However, if you have an insurance in Japan, you don't have to purchase UOU medical insurance. If you do not have the UOU insurance, you will pay the hospital fee in Korea and claim the insurance fee to the insurance company after returning to Japan.

Q) What kind of clothes do I need?

A) Please bring your sneakers and comfortable clothes. You will visit various spots in different cities and participate in different activities. And please bring jumpers just in case because the air conditioner in the room is strong.

Q) Can I stay in the dormitory personally after the program end?

A) Students for Fall semester will move in right after SKLCP, so you must move out on the returning date.
