Information on the 3rd COVID-19 vaccination at Ehime University

1. Date and time

The reception starts 15 minutes before your reservation time.

Those who wish to be vaccinated, please read this page to the end and understand the contents before making a reservation.

Regardless of whether or not you have responded to the previous survey, please be sure to make a reservation if you wish to be vaccinated.

2. Vaccination site

Ehime University Hospital (Shitsukawa, Toon City) [Map] ※No smoking on site

*On the day of vaccination, those who come by car or motorcycle can use the parking lot of the hospital for free. If you are coming by car, please bring the issued parking ticket to the vaccination venue. (Discount process is required.) \rightarrow [Parking lot]

3. Shuttle Bus

Shuttle Bus service is available for students who have requested to use.

Notes:

- When making a vaccination reservation online, please make a request to use the bus.
- The schedule differs depending on the day of the vaccination, so please be sure to check the schedule for your vaccination date. We recommend you should use the bus that departs approximately one hour before the reserved time for the vaccination, as this will allow the reception and vaccination process to proceed smoothly.
- The departure and arrival point for the Johoku area is not the "Johoku Campus Main Gate" but "In front of the University Headquarters Entrance", so please be sure to check the map of the departure and arrival points. Bicycles and motorcycles cannot be parked in the parking lot at the university headquarters. Please use the Johoku Campus bicycle/motorcycle parking lot and come to the University Headquarters on foot.

- University staff are stationed at the arrival and departure points. Please be sure to follow their instructions.
- To prevent infection, please disinfect your hands, wear a mask, and refrain from talking on the bus. Please cooperate in filling out the passenger list (faculty, grade, and name), which will be circulated on the bus.
- We plan to limit the number of passengers in order to protect against infection. Please understand that you may be asked to wait as long as it does not affect your vaccination time.

4. Vaccination eligibility

Those who meet all of (1) (2) (3), and any of the following (4) through (7).

- (1) Must be 18 years of age or older.
- (2) 7 months have passed after the 2nd vaccination.

(3) Already received the 3rd vaccination ticket and preliminary checkup sheet from the city/town in which you reside.

(4) Student of Ehime University.

- (5) Faculty or staff of Ehime University (including university officers, part-time staff, and affiliated schools' teachers).
- (6) Person who works at Ehime University (co-op staff, temporary staff, etc.).
- (7) Family members of faculty and staff of Ehime University.

6. Before through after vaccination

Before vaccination

After the vaccination, you may experience pain at the point of vaccination, fatigue, fever, headache, or joint pain. As much as possible, please adjust your schedule so that you can avoid exertion on the day of and the day after the vaccination, and prepare antipyretic painkillers in advance. Antipyretic painkillers can be purchased at pharmacies. If you are concerned about taking the medicine, please consult a doctor. If it is difficult for you to prepare antipyretic painkillers in advance for financial or other reasons, please contact the university's Health Services Center on Thursdays or Fridays.

At the day of vaccination

Please be sure to bring the following three items with you on the day of the vaccination.

(1) Vaccination ticket and pre-screening questionnaire

* You must bring your own vaccination ticket and pre-screening questionnaire with you to be vaccined. ** Be sure to take your body temperature on the day of vaccination and fill it in.

- (2) Certificate of Vaccination for COVID-19(新型コロナウイルスワクチン 予防接種済証(臨時接種))
- (3) Your identity card (student ID card, staff ID card, insurance card, driving license, My Number card, etc.)

On the day of the vaccination, the receptionist will use the barcode displayed on the web reservation site, so please have the barcode displayed before lining up at the reception desk.

Points to keep in mind on the day of vaccination

- Please take your body temperature and fill in the pre-screening questionnaire.
- You will be vaccinated at the deltoid muscle of the shoulder. Please wear short sleeves or clothing that allows the shoulders to show.
- If you are unable to receive the vaccination on the day of the vaccination, please contact 089-955-9501 by 3:00 p.m. on the day of the vaccination. (We do not accept e-mails on the day of vaccination.)
- If you are not feeling well on the day of the vaccination, you will not be able to receive the vaccination. In addition, those who are suspected of having had close contact with a person infected with COVID-19 are not allowed to come to the vaccination site.

Post-vaccination precautions

On adverse reactions

Symptoms that are relatively common after vaccination include pain at the vaccination site, fever, headache, fatigue, myalgia, chills, and joint pain. Swollen lymph nodes are reported more frequently (about 20%) with the 3rd vaccination than with the 1st or 2nd vaccination. Fever caused by the vaccine often occurs within a day or two after vaccination and should be monitored by taking antipyretic and analgesic medications if necessary. If a fever persists for more than 2 days after receiving the vaccine, or if symptoms are severe, or if symptoms that are unlikely to be caused by the vaccine are observed, please consult the Ehime Prefectural Public Health Center or the university's Health Services Center.

© The 3rd vaccination outside the university

Ehime University's 3rd vaccination is available to those who have been vaccinated 7 months after the second vaccination, but some cities and towns offer the 3rd vaccination to those who have been vaccinated 6 months after the 2nd vaccination (i.e. those who have received the 3rd vaccination ticket). Regardless of your response in the previous survey, you can receive the 3rd vaccination at your preferable place.

Please note that you do not need to report to the Vaccination Task Force, even if you have responded "yes" to the previous survey and are vaccinated outside the university.
