University of Ulsan Summer Korean Language & Culture Program is a summer short-term program in which students from UOU's partner universities in Japan can learn Korean language and Korean culture for around three weeks during summer vacation. During this period, students will have the opportunity to improve their Korean language skills through language classes and to gain first-hand experience through various activities, including visits to key locations in Ulsan and time spent with Korean partners. 1. Qualification: Students enrolled at UOU's partner university in Japan and interested in Korean language and Korean culture

2. Required documents

- Application form (Please find the attached file)
- Personal statement (Please find the attached file)
- Colored copy of passport

* Please ensure that the list of applicants is attached when submitting the required documents.

3. Documents submission deadline: **May 11 (Mon) 2026 ~ May 20 (Wed) 2026**

* Please email the list of applicants first if you cannot submit the documents before the deadline.

4. Program period: **August 7 (Fri) 2026 ~ August 21 (Fri) 2026**

5. Program Fee: **1,350,000 KRW (health insurance fee is not included)**

* All participants are required to obtain appropriate insurance, such as travel insurance, in Japan.

* The invoice will be sent via email by **May 29 (Fri), 2026.**

* Program fee must be paid no later than **June 19 (Fri), 2026.**

* If the number of participants is not enough, the total cost could increase.

8. Details of program

1) Korean Language class

- 12 Korean lesson (3 hours for each lesson)
- 4 different levels of classes (Level 1 ~ Level 4) will be offered depending on the student's proficiency.
- Students will take level test to be enrolled at the right level of class.

2) Korean Cultural Experience (Related to the Korean Language classes)

- **Korean Traditional Onggi (pottery) Making**
: An experience where you can create your own Onggi plate.
- **Playing Traditional Games**
: Experience traditional Korean games such as Yutnori, Jegichagi, and Gonggi.
- **Taekwondo Training**
: A hands-on experience learning traditional Korean martial arts, Taekwondo.
- **Playing Board Games**
: Activities that allow you to bond with classmates and Korean partners.
- **Visiting an Amusement Park**
: Visit a Korean amusement park (Gyeongju World).
- **Ulsan Tour**
: A visit to famous tourist spots in Ulsan (Daewangam Park and Jangsaengpo Whale Culture Village).

General information for 2026 UOU KLCP

1. Arrival and Return

- **Arrival date:** August 5 (Wed) 2026 ~ August 6 (Thu) 2026
- **Return date:** August 22 (Sat) 2026 (Morning)

2. Transportation to the Airport

- Airport Pick-up and Drop-off service is provided on the arrival and departure dates.
- Pick-up and Drop-off Place: Gimhae(Busan)Airport

3. Accommodation

- On-campus twin dormitory rooms are provided with cooling facilities, toilets, and bathrooms.

4. Meal

- Breakfast is provided.
- Please note that lunch and dinner are not provided

5. Visa

- Japanese: No visa required (You can stay in Korea without a visa for up to 90 days)
- Foreigners with other nationality: Please check if visa is exempted or not. If necessary, please ask for assistance.

FAQ on Living for 2026 UOU KLCP

Q) How much does laundry cost?

A) In the dormitory, laundry cost is free.

Q) Do I need to exchange currency?

A) From the day you arrive in Korea, you will need Korean currency for meals and shopping, so please bring cash in KRW. Students who want to exchange money in Ulsan also can visit the bank on the campus. You can also use credit cards in most places in Korea.

Q) How much does it cost to live for three weeks?

A) It varies from person to person. Breakfast is included in the fee, but lunch and dinner are not provided. The meals at restaurants near campus are around 15,000 KRW.

Q) Can I use Wifi in the dormitory?

A) You can access Wi-Fi through the school wireless Internet, but depending on the distance from the router, there are some rooms where Wi-Fi is not working well.

Q) Does UOU offer pillows and bedding?

A) Yes, it is provided. You can also bring your own bedding if you want. Hair dryers are not provided. Please bring your own if necessary.

Q) Is the distance between the dormitory and the classroom far?

A) You will stay in the on-campus dormitory. The classrooms are very close to the dormitory.

Q) How about insurance?

A) Due to limited demand, University of Ulsan may not be able to provide insurance. Please make sure to obtain appropriate insurance, such as travel insurance, individually in Japan before the program begins.

Q) What items do I need to bring?

A) Please bring your sneakers and comfortable clothes. You will visit various spots in different cities and participate in different activities. Please bring a jumper just in case, as the air conditioning in the room can be strong. If you are taking any medication, please make sure to bring it with you.

Q) Can I stay in the dormitory personally after the program end?

A) Students for Fall semester will move in right after KLCP, so you must move out on the returning date (August 22 (Sat) morning).
